# A growing collection of free resources to support people through the coronavirus pandemic

Since the beginning of lockdown in the UK, we've been developing a range of free coronavirus resources to support you and the people you care about at this really difficult time. Most recently:

- We've published two adapted versions of our picture story 'Beating the Virus' for audiences living outside the UK (EU version & Global version).
- Several volunteers have **translated resources** into other languages. (Please get in touch if you would like assist with further translations!)
- A new resource for supporters around death and dying is now available: 'Let's talk
  about...when someone is ill or dies from coronavirus: Online support for
  people with learning disabilities'. It contains images and suggested questions to
  prompt discussion about the impact of people dying from coronavirus.
- We have published a story for use in **secure settings**, endorsed by the RCGP.
- A new story about **coronavirus testing** is in development, which we hope will be available in the next few weeks.




#### A Recovery Curriculum: Loss and Life for our children and schools post pandemic

"How will it be for children when they return to school? It would be naive to think that they will pick up where they left off on the day their school went into lock down." Prof Barry Carpenter, CBE, Professor of Mental Health in Education, Oxford Brookes University (and former Beyond Words Trustee) has co-launched the Recovery Curriculum, enabling schools to consider the processes they will need to put in place to successfully transition children back to school.
